**Anchorage AK** – More than 250 volunteers are due to turn out Wednesday, Sept. 12, for the United Way of Anchorage annual Day of Caring. The Day of Caring is the single biggest day of corporate volunteer work in the city. Independent Sector, a national organization of nonprofits, pegs the value of each volunteer hour at \$24.62. So Anchorage businesses and their employees will be giving more than \$20,000 to the community in work from landscaping and fence painting to sorting food donations and hosting an ice cream social.

Here are three locations where volunteers will be at work today:

Food Bank of Alaska, 2121 Spar Road: Volunteers from Nordstrom and J.C. Penney will help to sort food donations at 2121 Spar Road in Anchorage. The crew from J.C. Penney will be on hand from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. (Contact at food bank, Karla Jutzi, 222-3112).

Anchorage Pioneer Home: 923 West 11<sup>th</sup> Ave: Volunteers from Alyeska Pipeline Service Co. will host bingo for Pioneer Home residents from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. (contact, Robyn Brune, 382-0500); ExxonMobil will wash vehicles, paint a fence, landscape and do housecleaning from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Well Fargo's crew will have an ice cream social for residents from 1-3 p.m. (Contact at Pioneer Home, Bob Montague, 343-7240),

Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center, Mile 79 Seward Highway, Girdwood: A crew from Bristol Bay Native Corporation will plant trees and shrubs at the center from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. They'll also take advantage of the venue to squeeze in a little lip-syncing practice for a competition.
